Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The primary focus of the workshop was on Holocaust education and remembrance in Italy, with a particular emphasis on the involvement of Jewish organizations in this field. Using this as a foundation, we explored and examined the educational approaches presented by our European partners. Through hands-on exploration, participants gained valuable insights into the educational initiatives undertaken by different institutions. Engaging in meaningful discussions, we had the opportunity to delve further into the topics covered in the presentations and reflect on how these perspectives can be effectively integrated into our own educational practices. We also considered the quote by Peter Burke:

“It is important to ask the question, who wants whom to remember what, and why? Whose version of the past is recorded and preserved...?” (Collective Memory, 2012)

Program:

Wednesday, October 25th, from 3 pm: ‘Ricordiamo insieme’ – Memorial ceremony commemorating the Nazi raid against Jews in Rome on October 16, 1943, followed by a welcome speech and a welcome dinner.

Thursday, October 26th: Insights into Holocaust remembrance and education in Italy – Current discourses and the role of the Jewish community. Visit to the Fondazione del Museo della Shoah. Dialogue and hands-on sessions: 1) Remembering/working at/with a historical site and 2) Working with school classes – Presentation and discussion of practical approaches from the European network partners. Our focus also includes the meta-level to gain insights into current challenges, methods, and concepts used by educators in the field of Holocaust Education.

Friday, October 27th: Dialogue and hands-on session: Including transnational perspectives – Presentation and discussion of practical approaches from the European network partners. Guided tour of the Jewish Museum of Rome. Final round and outlook. The workshop concludes at 1 pm.
